The therapist will provide individual and group counseling, conduct assessments, run groups, and assist in community outreach efforts.

- Provide individual and group counseling to clients under supervision depending on the type of license.
- Conduct intake assessments and treatment planning
- Conduct therapy sessions (individual, couples, family and group formats)
- Maintain confidential case notes and documentation in compliance with ethical and business standards.

- Assist in community workshops and wellness initiatives focused on mental health education.
- Collaborate with a multidisciplinary team to provide holistic support services.
- Participate in weekly supervision and training sessions, as offered.
- Support program development through research, outreach, and engagement with community partners.
